Based in High Point, North Carolina, USA, new-and-upcoming glam rock band Pageant has just recently released their debut album, Walkin' The Line! The album is full of fast riffs, an 80s-era-Vince Neil-esque voice, and that classic glam rock sound that takes you all the way back to the 1980s Sunset Strip back in West Hollywood, California, USA. Pageant's sound isn't exactly like the classics from the 80s & 90s, that being Guns 'N Roses, Warrant, Mötley Crüe, or even Poison, but you can definitely hear the influences through the guitars and the vocals. Walkin' The Line is a short 25 minutes and 47 seconds, but is jam-packed with heavy glam riffs, noticeable classic glam rock influences, with a twinge of blues-like guitar.

As soon as the first actual song on the album, "Howlin", starts playing, you might be picturing a 20 year old Vince Neil or even Jani Lane in your head singing in 2023. The fast-paced drums & guitar riffs, matched up with the catchy melody and the lyrics, make for a perfect full first song on Walkin' The Line.

"Love By The Minute" is a short and fast 2 minutes — the song is over before you know it! With "Love By The Minute", Roxxi's vocals become somewhat more 80s-like, with a hint of scratchiness and what seems to be a heavy influence of Vince Neil. The drums are rapid, as are the riffs, to the point that it makes you want to get up and dance!

When it comes to "Voodoo Kiss," the song gets a little harsher in the style of glam rock, leaning much more into an actual metal song. There is much more of an actual sound similar to Mötley Crüe sound. The song is one of those songs that makes you bob your head to the beat, and/or tap your foot along. The song makes you feel like you're going on a long drive down the road at night in the heart of the US, along crops and grass. The second-to-last track, "All Dolled Up (With Nowhere to Go)", is a little repetitive when it comes to the chorus, however the melody and the rhythm, as well as the overall greatness of the song, makes up for said repetitiveness. "All Dolled Up" sounds like a song straight from the 1980s Sunset Strip. The heavy riffs sound like they were ripped straight out of Mötley Crüe's unreleased tracks, with the drums being When you listen to it, you might feel like you're



right back there on the Sunset Strip, perhaps on a date with Vince Neil or Tommy Lee.

"Better Things Coming" is a track that you'll more than likely recognize from the song recommendations page - this track is right at the tippy top of the list. "Better Things Coming" is full of good riffs, along with a wonderful solo from Dezzy Fox. The bass is loud and pounds through the rest of the song about three-quarters (4) in. Throughout the song, there is a noticeable sound that seems to be some sort of distortion going on in the background, which is an interesting thing to add to a glam rock song. It's something you typically don't hear in a glam rock or glam metal song. The drums, especially the cymbals, are nice and loud for the entirety of the song, as are the guitars and the riffs.

Overall, I would give the album a solid 6/10. The songs are very catchy, and the riffs are wonderful. However, the lyrics in some songs are slightly repetitive. The great sound, the great influences, and the fast-paced, foot-tapping songs make up for the repetitiveness in the lyrics throughout the album. Walkin' The Line is a phenomenal start & an amazing debut album for Pageant! I — and hopefully you, the reader — cannot wait to see what Pageant has next in store for their fans.
